PRINCIPAL news

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have arrived at the end of what has been a very challenging term for our school community. Everyone, children, parents and staff have had to make many adjustments throughout this time to make the children's learning, whether at home or school, run as smoothly as possible. Many of these adjustments were made very quickly as there was an abrupt end to learning at school late last term and a move to learning using a variety of methods including the online platforms.

Although it was for a significant period of time, I must acknowledge the positive way parents responded to the challenge and supported their children and adhered to the restrictions placed on us. Recently many parents participated in a survey conducted by the Catholic Schools Office, Broken Bay. This was an anonymous survey that was seeking to provide each school some feedback regarding the school's response during the Covid-19 situation but also provide further thoughts about the school and diocese regarding education and facilities. I am very grateful to the parents who were able to complete this survey as it will be a good point of reference for me and the staff moving forward.

I have included with this newsletter a copy of the combined data to each of the survey questions in the form of graphs. The survey results were overwhelmingly positive. The general feedback highly valued the community aspect that is considered to be a strength here at St Patrick's.

Athletics carnival

Although next term's school athletics carnival is currently scheduled for Week 2, under current Covid-19 restrictions the school will not be able to hold the event. We are looking to hold the carnival later in the term dependent on securing a booking the local athletics facility and a change in restrictions from the NSW Government.

A reminder that this Thursday 2nd July is the last day of Term 2 for lessons as Friday 3rd July has been declared as a pupil free day.

Please remember that supervision is available for a limited number of students through our Before and After School Care provider Royston Kids. <u>Children need to be registered with the service before they can attend</u>. Since the children have returned to full-time face to face lessons the school has employed cleaners to maintain a cleaning regime during each day to support good hygiene. Even though the restrictions for Covid-19 have become more relaxed in recent weeks this cleaning process will be continued into Term 3.

Semester 1 Reports

Today you will have access to your child's Semester One report for the 2020 school year through Compass.

Due to changes created by Covid-19, the usual format of student reports has been altered. In Term 2 the priority for learning has been Religious Education, English and Mathematic. This semester report will provide information on your child's achievement in these priority areas. More detail about the reporting process will be provided with the school report.

Please take the time to thoroughly peruse the report in light of these factors. I also encourage you to talk constructively and positively with your child on his / her success and challenges outlined in the report.

Parent/Teacher Interviews

Parents who would like to meet their child's teacher to discuss the report are most welcome to do so. Information will be provided this week that will give parents the opportunity to make an appointment through Compass for a face to face interview during Week 2 next term.

I understand that due to the Covid-19 situation not all parents will be comfortable with a face to face meeting. The option for a phone interview as an alternative method of speaking with your child's teacher will also be made available from Week 3.

Uniform Shop Donation

The donation of second-hand uniforms by parents to our school uniform shop demonstrates the generosity of our school community. By giving back to the community in this way families have access to low cost, quality uniforms for their children. Profits from the sale of second-hand uniforms are traditionally used to support initiatives in our local community.

Previous donations have been to a local Women's Refuge Centre and St. Vincent de Paul. Last week a donation from sales from 2019 and 2020 was given to assist the team of doctors and nurses at Hornsby Hospital Emergency Department. It was a great honour to meet the staff of the Emergency Department supported by parent and student representatives. The staff spoke proudly of the work they have been doing recently during the Covid-19 pandemic. We also had a short tour of the Emergency Department and was told about the money staff spend from their own pockets to support the ED. We can be rightly proud of the difference the donation will make for our local community.

I would also like to acknowledge the tireless work that our uniform shop volunteers have given recently to keep the uniform shop functioning during the Covid-19 restrictions. The sale of second-hand uniforms at a low cost provides a wonderful service for our school community. We truly thank Deb, Claire and Mell for giving their time freely over many years to keep this great service running for the benefit of so many.

Dismissal

Next term we will be adjusting the school dismissal processes to maximise classroom learning time in the afternoon session. Currently we have K-2 children and their siblings preparing for dismissal to start at 2:30pm. From next term we will move the dismissal time to 2:40pm and move the Kiss and Drop back to its usual time starting from 3:15pm. Along with other adjustments at school it will provide a longer period of learning time in the afternoon session that will allow the children more time for learning.

Good Wishes

We wish the Soady Family well as they begin a new adventure moving on from our school community. I want to also acknowledge the role Evan had taken on as the Catholic Schools Parent Representative for St Patrick's and the ongoing strong support the family has provided the school. Although it is sad to see both Juliette and Benjamin leave the school, we wish them every success in the future at their new school.

At the end of this term, the online Uniform Shop will be moving from Flexischools to QKR!

From Friday 3rd July, please place orders for uniform on QKR!

This will mean we only have one online payment platform across the school. Please check as soon as possible whether you have a credit balance with Flexischools and either spend it by placing a uniform shop order, or close your account and Flexischools will arrange a refund of any outstanding balance.

To close your account: Login to the Flexischools website (if on a mobile device, select "Help" on the bottom right and then "Visit Desktop Site") and select "My Profile", select "Account Status" and select "Close Account". If you have a child at another school that uses Flexischools, or if you do not have a balance, there is no need to close your account unless you wish to do so.

The uniform shop will remain online only for now. This is to keep adults on the school premises to a minimum in line with guidelines due to Covid-19. This will be reviewed by Mr Vane-Tempest in due course.

Access to the shop for second hand items and for trying-on is by appointment (<u>https://www.picktime.com/stpatsuniformshop</u>).
