## PRINCIPAL news



### Dear Parents and Carers,

This Saturday, 15th August, we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. The feast of the Assumption celebrates Mary being assumed body and soul into heavenly glory. Mary was an ordinary person who was blessed by God, became the mother of Jesus and was always there for him.

On this day the church acknowledges God's faithfulness to Mary and the trust she had in God. Her love and devotion supported Jesus throughout his life and is an example for us all. Mary is the Queen of All Saints. The children will celebrate a class liturgy this Friday to celebrate this important feast day.

### **Celebrating Holy Mass Together**

The Feast of the Assumption is usually a Holy Day of Obligation, however due to COVID-19 restrictions, churches, religious gatherings and places of worship are subject to social distancing requirements and have strict maximum attendance limits. The parish also has other measures in place as part of their COVID-19 Safety plan. Catholics from the Diocese of Broken Bay currently have a dispensation from their Sunday Mass obligation.

For those wishing to attend Mass, you will need to make a reservation either by calling the parish office or preferably via the parish office email, <a href="mailto:parishkccp@bbcatholic.org.au">parishkccp@bbcatholic.org.au</a>. When you attend Mass, you need to see the Usher on your arrival and have your name marked off or have your name recorded if not on the list. Collection of your contact details is required to comply with the NSW Government's Covid-19 Safe Guidelines.

### **First Holy Communion**

With the restrictions in place on numbers attending weekend Masses, this year the parish will be holding Eucharist across several Masses over two weeks. Please note that this programme may change if new restrictions are enforced. The reception of First Eucharist will therefore be received at St Patrick's Church, Asquith on Saturday 22nd August at a special 4pm Mass for First Communicants and their families ONLY. Saturday 22nd August is the usual 6pm Vigil Mass that is for parishioners to attend, however, a few Communicants and families will also be present at this Mass. On Sunday 23rd August, there will be a special 12 midday Mass for First Communicants and their families ONLY.

### St Mary of the Cross (MacKillop)

The feast of Mary MacKillop was celebrated on 8th August. The children have been learning about Mary MacKillop and last Friday some of our Years 5 and 6 students from the MAG (Mercy in Action) group took part in a prayer presentation during the Friday morning assembly.

### **Feast of the Assumption**

Next Saturday, the Church will celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of Mary when she was taken up, body and soul, into the kingdom of heaven. **Scripture:** Luke 1:39-56. **Reflection:** What images or icons of Mary do we have in our homes? What do these tell us about Mary? What hope does this feast bring to our lives as Catholics? On Friday the

children will have a special liturgy in their classrooms to celebrate this feast and reflect on Mary.



### **Religious Education at St Patrick's**

The children are presently working on their Religious Education unit on Mission. This year we have taken the works of Mercy as our focus in preparation for the Feast of Our Lady of Mercy on 24th September. Each class has taken a work of mercy (taken from the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy from the Sisters of Mercy) which will be a focus for their Religious Education work this term. As parents, we often take the work the children do in Religion for granted. The teachers at St Patrick's work very hard to ensure that what you do in the home in helping them along their faith journey is complimented at school and with the parish in Religious Education. I recommend that from time to time you ask your child to share some insights from their class work in Religious Education.

We pray as a community that our faith will be a source of strength for us in the present circumstances that surround our world. We pray especially to St Mary of the Cross MacKillop and our blessed mother Mary to guide us through these times.


### **NSW Premier's Reading Challenge**



here. Students have until Friday, 28th August to complete the challenge.












### 2020 Book Week
