#### PRINCIPAL news

Dear Parents and Carers,

#### Father's Day

I trust that all the dads, granddads and significant male figures were thoroughly spoilt on Father's Day last Sunday. A big thank you goes to Monique Ciampi and Rima Melia who organised and wrapped gifts ready for the Father's Day Stall last Friday. The children had a great time choosing from an array of gifts and I am sure all those who received their gifts on the weekend appreciate the efforts of our organisers.

#### Child Protection Week and eSafety

Yesterday was Safer Internet Day 2020 which is an annual worldwide event that aims to create a safer internet for all. The global awareness day encourages people to navigate the online world safely, by developing four critical skills: Respect, Responsibility, Reasoning and Resilience.

On Safer Internet Day, millions of people unite to inspire positive change and raise awareness about online safety. It's important that young people develop online behaviours that help them navigate the internet and social media in an informed, safe and meaningful way.

When used safely, and in balance with off-line activities, a young person's time online can; be educational, help build connections and fun.

This week many of the children had an opportunity to participate in a webinar presented by eSafety Commissioner's expert training team for the National Child Protection Week Virtual Classroom. I encourage all parents to spend some this week to remind their children about staying safe online.

During the webinar the whole class participates in a live video lesson where a trainer talks through PowerPoint slides and students will complete a worksheet during the presentation where they will:

- explore what privacy and personal information means
- understanding what an online 'stranger' can be
- develop strategies and skills to secure accounts
- learn where to go for help and support

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#### School Uniform

The weather will be variable in the next few weeks of the term with warm sunny days becoming the norm with the occasional colder wet days. During this time parents have the choice of whether to send children in either full Summer or Winter uniform. This term during Weeks 9 & 10 we will have a whole school focus on our school rule "We take pride in our appearance."

Please make sure that hats, jackets and jumpers are labelled with the child's name so they can be easily returned if misplaced. We often find that jackets and jumpers are removed when the day warms up and left in the playground.

Recently I have needed to remind some of the children to wear the correct uniform to school each day. I understand from time to time that there are challenges having uniforms ready, when shoes go missing or the washing doesn't dry. However, some children are choosing to not wear the correct uniform daily. I have asked teachers to continue to remind the children and where necessary send a note home to communicate the situation to parents.

I thank parents in advance for their support with having the children come to school each day dressed in their uniform.

#### Evacuation

Last week the school practiced a trial lockdown procedure partly in preparation for possibility of being closed due to Covid. This lockdown practiced an evacuation from the playground to classrooms and then simulated the routine for an early pickup by parents. This week the school will provide details to parents about the school procedures if the school was to be closed due to Covid. Please take the time to read the information as it details the process that parents need to follow so that pickup is completed in an organised and timely way.

#### Symptoms or Sickness

I remind parents that the NSW Government recently announced new restrictions for schools in NSW for the remainder of Term 3 as the state tries to stem new coronavirus outbreaks. Most importantly for the health and safety of everyone in our community, staff and students who suspect they may have COVID-19 must not return to school until they return a negative COVID-19 result and are symptom-free. During this time schools must sight the negative COVID-19 test result before a student can return to school.
