Dear Parents and Carers

Covid Safe Requirements

Recently we have seen some easing of restrictions in the community by the NSW Government and this may continue over the coming weeks. This has not transferred to the school setting as there has been no movement by the government to ease restrictions in schools.

Currently parents/carers and other non-essential visitors are not allowed on the school site and although we looked to reschedule some events to this term, school events involving parent groups are unable to be held at this time.

I acknowledge that this is a difficult and at times frustrating situation. The recent Book Week Parade should have been a wonderful community event and we would have been delighted to have parents on site yesterday to witness and enjoy the Book Week Parade.

Please be assured that consideration of the Covid safe guidelines occurs for each event. We continue to keep students within their relevant grade group for learning activities and adhere to the time limits and other measures for school assemblies.

Visit by The Director of Schools

Last Thursday we welcomed our new Director of Catholic Schools Broken Bay Mr. Danny Casey to our school. Although a low-key visit, Danny was delighted to meet the staff and children and tour the school facilities. Danny was very impressed by the children he met which is a credit to our parent community.

A key discussion point was the positioning of the school for growth in the future and creating the pathway for students from our school to our diocesan high schools.

St. Leo's Priority Feeder Schools Program

Last term I communicated to parents the beginning of the Priority Feeder School Program with St. Leo's. I was able to meet with the Principal of St. Leo's, Mr. Tony Gleeson, to discuss further ways we can develop a stronger partnership into the future.

I was fortunate to have a tour of the new facilities at St. Leo's and came away very impressed by their modern, contemporary learning spaces and the new facilities they have. I will say that I was even more impressed by the students I met and the future school curriculum that is occurring there.

As a Catholic system of schools we encourage parents to select Catholic primary schools for their children and wish to attract families back from the public system by making it clear that they are gaining a preferred or priority application status into St Leo's for high school. For our local community, I believe that parents should see St. Patrick's and St. Leo's as a clear K-12 pathway within the Catholic system.

In my discussions with Tony and the team at St. Leo's we are developing ways to further strengthen our partnership and I look forward to the many opportunities that it will bring to benefit our school community.

Kinder Screeners

Next week we are very excited to welcome our new Kindergarten students for 2021 as they participate in a Kinder Screener Session either on Tuesday 27th or Wednesday 28th October. During each session the children will have a chance to get to know the school environment and meet and spend time with some of their new classmates. It will also be an opportunity for teachers to get to know the children as learners and prepare for their start at big school next year.

Canteen

This Friday will see the reopening of the canteen with a limited menu of items for sale. A Covid-safe plan will be in place for everyone's health and safety. I ask you to refer to the flyer sent home today for the details of prepurchasing items online through QKR.







Keeping your children safe when dropping off and picking up at school

Here are a few things you can do to help keep your children and others safer during drop-off and pick-up times during the school week:

- Make sure your children are fastened in the correct child car seat for their age and size and that it is fitted correctly.
- Stick to the 40km/h speed limit in a school zone and look out for children who may be about.
- Watch for flashing lights on buses. They let you know that there may be children crossing or about to cross the road. A 40km/h limit applies when school bus lights flash.
- Always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.

- Always park and turn legally around schools.
 Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous during busy school drop-off and pick-up times.
- Drop your children off and pick them up on the school side of the road in your school's designated drop-off and pick-up area. Never call out to them from across the road – they may run to you without checking for traffic.
- It's safest for children to get out of the car through the Safety Door, away from passing traffic. This is the rear footpath side door of the car.

Road safety

Walking together safely to and from school

Walking to school and back home again is a great way to spend time with your children and encourage safe and healthy behaviours.

Here are a few things you can do to help keep your children safer as a pedestrian:

- Talk with your children about being alert in the road environment.
- Plan and practice your trip to school so you use pedestrian crossings where possible.
- Always hold your child's hand. Children need your help to spot dangers such as vehicles coming out of driveways. They can also be easily distracted and wander into traffic.
- Meet your child near the school gate and don't call them from across the road.
- Explain why the place you have chosen is the safest place to cross.
- Remind your child to STOP! LOOK! LISTEN! THINK! every time they cross the road and keep checking until safely across.
- Talk to them about why they should stop, look, listen, think before crossing a driveway, road or carpark.

Young children can learn and practice these safe pedestrian behaviours with you. This will help them to be safer pedestrians when they are old enough to travel alone.
