

PRINCIPAL news



Dear Parents, Carers, Girls and Boys,

We are rapidly approaching the end of another school year and 2020 will soon be a memory. For me the year has passed very quickly but has been very eventful and, as we have all experienced at times, challenging. This year parents along with the school and the children have had to quickly adjust to a new normal. I would like to acknowledge the great support we continue to receive from the parent community and your ongoing commitment to seeking a Catholic education for your children.

As we prepare to say goodbye to 2020 and the staff and students leaving and moving on to other adventures, we also look forward to the celebrations of Jesus' birth at Christmas.

Elsewhere in this newsletter is a list of Christmas Masses here in our Ku-Ring-Gai Chase Catholic Parish. I urge our families to come to Mass over Christmas to celebrate as a family. I pray the peace and joy of the newborn Jesus gives all our families hope for the New Year and holidays.

School Hygiene and Safety

Throughout most of the year the school has put in place Covid-safe measures for the health and safety of our entire school community. As we finish the year and move into a new year, it seems that the school will need to continue to adhere to restrictions made by the NSW Government.

I am pleased to advise that the school will continue the School Hygienist services at least until the end of Term 1, 2021. The school will provide details of any adjustments to Covid-safe procedures as we are advised by Catholic Schools Broken Bay and the NSW Government.

I thank all parents and carers for the support and cooperation that has been given during this time. At times, the school has had to make quick adjustments to our usual routines and procedures due to government announcements. Each time our parent community have been outstanding with their positive and supportive response.

Semester 2 Reports

Tomorrow, all families will be able to access Semester 2 reports via Compass. I encourage parents to read them carefully, focusing on effort and comparing them with the Semester 1 reports to look at growth. Parents are encouraged to contact the office if you would like to discuss the report with your child's teacher.

Staffing and Classes 2021

Last week we congratulated Mrs Katrina Brown on her new appointment at her new school for 2021. Yesterday I communicated to the school community that Mrs Carmel Kevill will also be leaving our school community to take up opportunities at a tertiary level.

As a result, the school is now in the process of seeking suitable teachers to replace both Katrina and Carmel in classrooms and for the REC Leadership position. Obviously replacing teachers at any stage of the year takes some time to organise. I acknowledge that the school year is coming to an end soon. I am seeking to have all teaching positions in place by the end of the school year so that the school community will know staffing for classes for 2021. On Friday, the students will have the opportunity to step up into their 2021 classes and meet their teacher for next year. Please 'talk up' your child's teacher and potential options in the lead-up to this date. It is the best way to ensure a positive build-up to next year.

P&F Donation

There are many parents that are tireless in their efforts to support the school in its endeavours to educate and care for the children while they are at school. This is particularly true of the P&F and their committees. One of the huge benefits the school receives through the P&F is fundraising. At the last meeting the P&F made a generous donation to the school of over ten thousand dollars to support the acquisition of new equipment and facilities that will benefit the school community.

The equipment and facilities to be purchased will be new musical instruments, codable robotics technology, sporting equipment including mats and balance beam for gymnastics, outdoor chess pieces and a new awning for the canteen. The school is very thankful and grateful for this wonderful donation and ongoing support by our amazing P&F volunteers.

Leadership Assembly

This Friday 11th December we will hold a special Leadership Assembly to acknowledge, congratulate and thank our current School Captains. At the assembly we will also hand over to our newly announced School and Sports Captains for 2021. Parents are invited to join the assembly online via the Zoom link provided to all parents yesterday through Compass.

Liturgy and Kinder Blessing of Year 6 Buddies

Next Tuesday morning the school will celebrate the end of the school year with a short liturgy. During the liturgy we will give thanks for the gifts that each one of us brings to our school community. We will also acknowledge and thank those in our community who are leaving us including our Year 6 graduating students. One of our long-standing traditions is for our Kindergarten children giving their Year 6 buddies a blessing. This is a special moment that mirrors the blessing that was placed on the Kinder children at the Beginning School Mass by their Year 6 buddies. A link was sent through Compass to all parents to access the liturgy online via Zoom.

Guard of Honour and Dismissal

Another wonderful tradition at St. Patrick's is to farewell all the Year 6 graduating students along with other leaving students and staff with a Guard of Honour. This will begin from approximately 2:40pm next Tuesday 15th December. As a result, the dismissal of children from K-2 and their siblings will be slightly delayed. Dismissal will begin from approximately 2:50pm with K-2 children and their siblings gathering in the hall.

To avoid a mass gathering outside the school to witness the Guard of Honour and to assist with social distancing, Year 6 parents are invited to view from the Basketball Court (access via the back gate) or the area between the hall and the school office. I ask that Year 6 parents avoid mingling, wait for their child to come to them after the Guard of Honour has finished and then leave the school site in a timely way.



Mathematics Assessment Interview

At the beginning of the school year every child from Years 1 to 6 in a CSBB school is assessed using the Mathematics Assessment Interview (MAI). The Mathematics Assessment Interview is a clinical interview with an associated research-based framework of growth points that describe key stages in the learning of 4 number domains. Growth points enable teachers to: identify any children who may be vulnerable in a given domain; identify the zone of proximal development for each child in each domain so instruction may be customised and precise; and identify the diversity of mathematical knowledge in a class.

We will be having an assessment day for Years 1-4 on Thursday 28th January, 2021. Parents will receive information regarding how to book these interviews via the Compass App. Grades will be allocated timeslots, and we ask that parents adhere to these timeslots as best as possible. There will be provisions made for families with siblings across Years 1-4. We ask that when booking for your family that you do not book for students in Years 5 and 6. Due to time constraints, students in Years 5 and 6 will be having their assessment during the first few weeks of school during class time.

WAR ON WASTE (Mary Connor)

St Patrick's is Declaring a War on Waste!

Over the past few months, our school community has begun a war on waste. Why? Well, we want a future for these children that is not dominated by worries about climate change, greenhouses gases and rising sea levels. We want our children to become responsible global citizens who care about their environment and about the future.

Pope Francis in his encyclical Laudato Si has called not only for Catholics, but for everyone to develop an ecological consciousness "What kind of world do we want to leave to those who come after us, to children who are now growing up? (#160)...many things have to change course, but it is we human beings above all who need to change. (#202)

Single use plastics are a major environmental issue. We therefore, encourage you to prepare healthy lunches without the use of cling wrap, alfoil or ziplock bags. Reusable lunch boxes are the way to go. Reusable drink bottles are also ideal.

We have begun a 'return and earn' system for juice boxes and have already collected \$40, from which we purchased some beautiful electronic candles. We are also taking soft plastics to Coles or Woolies for "Redcycling". Our compost bins are in action, but unfortunately we see many whole pieces of fruit in them. We also see many uneaten sandwiches in plastic bags in our bins. Please talk to your children about what they will eat at school and ask them to take home uneaten food, especially whole fruit.

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Road safety



Driving safely near school buses

There is a 40km/h speed limit for traffic passing a school bus that is setting down or picking up school children. This speed limit is for all traffic travelling in the same direction as the bus, whether the bus is stationary or moving.

Lights will flash on the front and back of the bus reminding drivers that there may be children crossing or about to cross the road.

Buses can't stop quickly because they are large and heavy vehicles. So, remember:

- Reduce speed to 40km/h when bus lights are flashing
- Give way to buses
- Watch out for children crossing
- Never park in or near a bus stop or bus zone.

Informal school bus stops

Informal bus stops are not sign posted and are usually found in rural areas. They may be at the front of a property, or on the side of the road, which may make children difficult to see.

Road safety

Helping children on and off the bus safely

Your children are most at risk in the minutes after getting off the bus. Here are some ways you can reduce this risk:

- Always meet your child at the bus stop. Never meet them on the opposite side of the road and call them across.
- Wait until the bus has gone, then choose a safe place to cross the road. Remember to Stop! Look! Listen! Think!
- If you cannot meet your child, organise for another trusted adult to take your place.
- Wait at the bus stop and stand at least one step back from the edge of the road.
- Always wait until the bus has gone, then use a safe place to cross.
- Buckle up if the bus has seatbelts.

Model safe pedestrian behaviour. Children learn safe road user habits from you and will continue them later on when they are old enough to travel alone.

Until your child is at least eight years old, hold their hand on the footpath, in the carpark and when crossing the road. Up until at least 10 years old, supervise your child very closely, holding their hand when crossing the road.

STOP!

one step back from the kerb

LOOK! continuously both ways

LISTEN! for the sounds of approaching traffic

THINK! whether it is safe to cross and keep checking until safely across

Messages to share with your children in Kindergarten to Year 2

- Hold an adult's hand when you cross the road
- Use a safe place to cross the road
