# PRINCIPAL news

Dear Parents and Carers,

Last weekend we had a wonderful community celebration with the first of our School and Parish Family Masses for 2021. It was our Kindergarten families turn to celebrate Eucharist together and it was such a lovely occasion. This was the first School and Parish Family Mass since I started at St. Patrick's at the beginning of last year and although I had to wait such a long time my patience was rewarded with a special celebration with our youngest students.

I thank all parents who attended with their families and supported our kinder students. It is great to see our parents continued commitment to the spiritual development of their families and the commitment to being part of our school and parish communities.

# **Mother's Day Celebrations Cancelled**

Following the recent NSW Covid outbreak, the NSW Department of Health has issued renewed COVID restrictions which has caused the cancellation of our School Mother's Day celebrations tomorrow.

Given a number of the known hotspots that are within our Diocese and the government advice and advice from Catholic Schools Broken Bay that" the community avoids mingling in large groups over the coming days", we have decided to cancel all of our planned Mother's Day activities for tomorrow.

This is a very disappointing but necessary action to reduce the risk of Covid-19 infection and maintain the health and safety of our school community. I thank you in advance for your support with this issue and apologise for any inconvenience caused to family arrangements.

#### **Matthew Tan**

Last week our school Vice-Captain Matthew Tan represented at the NSW Schools State Tennis Championships in the Polding. The tournament is for the top juniors and resemble a Davis Cup and Fed Cup competition, providing the opportunity to compete in a team environment.

The Championships use a round robin format with play offs for each team in the finals round to decide final standings. The Tennis tournament was held over 3 days and Matthew was amongst a team of 5 players within Northern NSW, who placed 3rd overall.

Matthew was selected from this tournament to be part of the NSW Tennis Team. This is an amazing achievement. We are very proud of your humble manner and wish you the best of luck for your tennis future.

#### Canberra

Our Year 6 students are gearing up for their long-awaited excursion to Canberra in Week 5. The children have been learning about democracy as part of their history unit and this excursion will give them first-hand experience at the federal government level. It was a great disappointment that this and other overnight excursions were not able to take place in 2020, which makes this year's excursion all the more exciting. I thank our Year 6 teachers and Mrs Taylor in advance for the commitment they give to organising and the time they spend away from their families while attending the 3 day excursion.

## NAPLAN (National Assessment Program-Literacy and Numeracy)

Next week our Year 3 and Year 5 students complete the NAPLAN Assessments for Literacy and Numeracy. Although these assessments are only one aspect of the school's assessment and reporting process, they do provide valuable data to parents and our school that assists when making decisions about the students learning. We wish all the students well with these assessments.

# Australian Early Development Census (AEDC)

Between May and July this year, our school will be taking part in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC). This is a nationwide census/survey of early childhood development held once every three years. The AEDC is an Australian Government initiative run by the Department of Education, Skills and Employment and includes all children in their first year of full -time school.

The AEDC provides vital information to communities about how children are developing in the crucial early years. AEDC data is relied upon by schools, early childhood organizations, researchers and government to inform planning and improve services and supports for children and families.

The AEDC Instrument is completed by teachers about children in their first year of full-time school. The AEDC is voluntary and is not a school test. The information collected gives a picture of how children are developing before they start school in five key areas or domains. It shows what is being done well, and what can be improved. This is why it is important for all children in their first year of full-time school to be included in the AEDC.

## Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on Students with a Disability (NCCD) Year K-6

The NCCD takes place in August each year. Please refer to link for information on what, why, how and most importantly the benefits of NCCD for students, 'The information collected by the NCCD helps teachers, principals, education authorities and governments to better support students with disability at school."

This process will be a series of small steps rather than one big leap with enrolment meeting occurring this term followed by screeners and transition days in the second semester.

I warmly encourage parents who are seeking enrolment, or families you know who are seeking enrolment for Kindergarten 2022 and haven't yet applied, to do so in the *next few weeks*. Please pick up an application package from the office, or download here to receive one.

#### Uniform

A reminder with the changeable weather we are experiencing at this time of year we are now in a 'phase in' period for Winter uniform. Students may wear either full Summer or full Winter uniform (but not a combination) for the first four weeks to begin the term. Students should be in full Winter uniform by Monday 17 May. #### Sacrament of Confirmation

A reminder that the Sacrament of Confirmation 2021 will be celebrated within Masses on Sunday 5th September 2021 at 11.30am at St Bernard's ~ 2pm at St Patrick's ~ 4pm at St Patrick's. Under current Covid-safe restrictions these Masses are for candidates and incorporate ~ 1 child + 1 sponsor + 2 parents/caregivers only. Save the date!

During 2020, Bishop Anthony took the opportunity to make an adjustment to the age at which children in the Diocese of Broken Bay are eligible to make Confirmation. The Bishop advised that from 2021 Confirmation will be... "celebrated with those who have reached the age of 8, and who are typically in Year 3." and that "Reconciliation and Eucharist will ... be celebrated with those who are 9 and in Year 4."





Family Portrait day by Lasso Studios at St Patrick's


The Parents & Friends Association invites your family to come for a portrait by Lasso Studios on Sunday 16th May.
