- Parent/Teacher Interviews are scheduled for Week 9 (March 23rd 26th) with an evening session scheduled for Wednesday 25th March. - Each fortnight the school has a behaviour focus that all the children learn about. The behavioural focus during Weeks 6 & 7 is being a 'Respectful Learner' by speaking and listening respectfully. This includes the common courtesies of 'please', 'may I' and 'thank you', using a positive tone and manner but also look at the person you are speaking or listening to. I encourage parents to support this focus at home by discussing it as a family and acknowledging their child/ren when they get it right.
