Anzac Day Commemoration

On ANZAC Day our school captains Jake F and Sophie W represented our school proudly at the Hornsby RSL Branch ANZAC Day Commemoration by laying a wreath at the Dawn Service in Hornsby. Sacrament of Confirmation

A reminder that the Sacrament of Confirmation 2021 will be celebrated within Masses on Sunday 5th September 2021 at 11.30am at St Bernard's ~ 2pm at St Patrick's ~ 4pm at St Patrick's. During 2020, Bishop Anthony took the opportunity to make an adjustment to the age at which children in the Diocese of Broken Bay are eligible to make Confirmation. The Bishop advised that from 2021 Confirmation will be... *"celebrated with those who have reached the age of 8, and who are typically in Year 3." and that " Reconciliation and Eucharist will ... be celebrated with those who are 9 and in Year 4."*

Wakakirri

This year our school will be participating in the Wakakirri Story-Dance Festival in Term 3. The Aboriginal word Wakakirri means 'to dance a story' according to the Wangaaypuwan people from Cobar NSW. Wakakirri provides schools with a creative arts education program to develops student creativity, engagement and wellbeing through the sharing of stories and participation in the performing arts.

As a first-time entrant the school qualifies for extra support and will have the benefit of weekly input from a qualified dance instructor from Wakakirri. The children from Year 4, 5 & 6 who are participating in this event will be preparing from next week with our first rehearsals. It promises to be a wonderful experience for the children and we wish them every success with this initiative.
