PRINCIPAL news

Dear Parents, Carers, Girls and Boys,

After speaking to parents and staff last week, it is apparent that many in our school community have already experienced the challenges of the virus firsthand during the holiday break while many have not.

This week I advised parents via Compass that a member of the school community had recently tested positive to Covid-19. I expect that over the coming term that these alerts will become more common. To assist parents and carers, NSW Health has provided advice on testing and isolation recommendations for the community following exposure to COVID-19 that should be considered when making decisions for your child and family.

I thank parents and carers who have supported the current restrictions by maintaining the usual Covid-safe practices at drop-off and pick-up each day and continuing to utilise the RAT kits before school Monday and Wednesday morning. These combined efforts will slow the spread of the virus and assist the school to manage the school site and maintain the learning over the coming weeks.

This week we received the next two-week supply of RAT Kits. A box of 5 test kits will be labelled with each children's name and sent home with them today.

I remind parents to make sure they follow the Covid-safe guidelines:

If a student or staff member receives a **positive** RAT test, they need to

- o record the positive RAT result through the <u>Service NSW website</u> or <u>Service NSW app</u>
- o notify the school of the positive RAT or PCR test result as soon as possible

follow NSW Health advice to isolate for 7 days

School Events

Traditionally our school has many events scheduled throughout the year where our community can gather to support the efforts of the students in their learning, presentations and sporting events or celebrating together through our school liturgies and events like our annual P&F Welcome BBQ. Sadly, under current restrictions we are unable to hold these events as we would normally.

Adjustments will continue to be made while our world lives with the Covid-19 Pandemic as the safety and well-being of our community is our highest priority. In response we will continue to put in place the necessary adjustments where required.

School Mass

Our Beginning of Year School Mass is scheduled for Thursday 17th February at 12pm. The limited number of attendees allowed in the church and the lack of a large covered (weatherproof) space in the school does make planning and staging school liturgies more challenging.

I acknowledge that the Beginning School Mass is usually well attended by parents however the church has a limited capacity of 200 under the current Covid-safe restrictions.

This will allow for some grades (Kinder, Year 4, 5 & 6) and staff to attend while also maintaining cohorts and other Covid-safe practices. Years 1, 2 & 3 will attend virtually via Zoom.

The traditional Year 6 blessing of the Kindergarten children is under consideration. Disappointingly, it is likely that it won't be able to go ahead in its usual format due to the Covid-safe restrictions in place.

Year 6 leaders will also be acknowledged at the mass. I expect that a maximum of 2 family members for each school leader will be able to attend. More information will be sent to these families soon.

Communication Methods & Protocols

Communication is an important and crucial aspect to our work as partners. Each year the communication protocols are provided to the community to support that vital partnership between home and school. The school values strong and respectful communication and when we get this right, the children are best supported.

If you wish to speak to a teacher:

- You can make contact through the school office staff by phone, via email or in person. The office staff will pass this message onto the teacher concerned. The teacher will either confirm an appointment, or phone to talk within a reasonable timeframe (usually 24 to 48 hours or the following Monday if contact is made on a Friday). Often a return call might come earlier, but for practical reasons, at least one day's grace is required.
- Under the current guidelines provided by the NSW Government, no visitors are allowed to visit school sites for the first 4 weeks of Term 1. Please be aware that other options including phone, email or video conferencing through Zoom are available and may be more convenient to parents and have an added benefit of providing a non-contact Covid-safe environment.

If it is a matter to be conveyed in writing:

- Please either send a note to the teacher/staff member or an email to the front office.
- Emails will be forwarded to the teacher within normal hours and in a timely way. If confidential, please send as an attachment and mark as confidential. The school email address is: spa@dbb.catholic.edu.au
- I ask that parents don't email teachers/staff directly. Emails received late at night or on weekends can impact on a staff member's personal and family situations and add to their stresses, especially if the matter is emotive or subjective. Also, if a staff member is on leave, delays in response can result.

I thank all parents in advance for adhering to and respecting these protocols and for your continued support.

Parent Information Meetings

Parent Information Meetings will take place online via Zoom next week on Tuesday 15th and Wednesday 16th February.

The purpose of these meetings is to provide an opportunity at the start of the school year for parents and carers to collectively meet their child's teacher. It will also allow teachers to provide information to parents and carers about class, grade and school routines and expectations, curriculum topics and planned events. Each grade will provide a brief summary of the information that will be presented.

Parents who have important information they wish to communicate to their child's class teacher are encouraged to make an appointment through the school office or communicate information via an email to the school office to be passed on to the class teacher.

Parking, Morning Drop Off and Afternoon Pickup

At this time of year it is often busier than usual, with many parents re-establishing routines for a new year. The increased traffic will impact on parking, drop-off and pick-up. Ultimately patience will be required from parents, grandparents and others as it won't be possible to be in and out quickly on most occasions. I ask parents to adhere to the procedures in place as a streamlined process benefit everyone.

This week I outlined the procedures for the morning and afternoon drop off and dismissal routines. These routines are for the most part working well. Thank you to parents who are mindful of driving slowly, using the pedestrian crossing and being vigilant with their young ones. I encourage parents using drive through to have the family name card on the car visor to assist with calling children to be ready for pick up. If you require a new card please contact the office via email to request a new one.

Safety is highly valued in our school community. Please remember to stay in your car when dropping off or picking up in the 'No Parking Zone' at the front of the school. When parents leave their vehicle to assist their child it slows the process down significantly and causes frustration.

I ask as a community we remain patient, keep calm and follow the protocols so that safety is maintained. Please refer to the supporting document provided earlier this week by the NSW and Local Government regarding current parking and traffic road rules around schools.
