Professional Learning and Planned Staff Development Days for the Remainder of 2022

Over the next two years all in NSW will be implementing new syllabus documents for English and Mathematics. In addition to this, Catholic Schools in the Broken Bay Diocese will be implementing a new syllabus document for Religious Education and adopting the newly developed Catholic Charter for the Broken Bay Diocese.



Student Representative Council News

The SRC are leading the way with recycling at our school. We are continuing to recycle plastic bread tags that will be delivered to a company called **AUSSIE BREAD TAGS FOR WHEELCHAIRS**. This company recycles the bread tags into products. These products are sold and the proceeds are used to purchase wheelchairs, mostly for those in need in South Africa.

> This will continue for the remainder of the school year. Kindergarten Gold and 5 Green have collected the most so far.

The SRC are also supporting the recycling of bread bag soft plastics. We ask that you save any bread bag, shake out its crumbs and send it into school. There is no need to wash your bags. We will collect them here at school. Our first goal is 5kg. This is about 14-16 bread bags filled with bread bags! St Patrick's... WE CAN DO THIS! For every 5kg's, our school will get 500 points to be used towards the purchasing of sports equipment made from the recycled plastic. For every 5kgs we collect, we can feel proud that it has been kept out of the ocean and landfill.


