#### Staffing

#### **Class Arrangements for 2023**

At this time of year, I am contacted by a few parents requesting their child to have a particular teacher or be in the same class as another student for the following year. I acknowledge that parents wish to advocate in the best interests of their child/ren, however it is not possible to promise any particular arrangements. **The school is still in the process of finalising staffing for 2023 and teacher and class allocation are still being decided.** 

Please be aware that each year teachers take great care in arranging classes and although not a perfect science the teachers endeavour to balance the classes according to many factors including the children's social and emotional needs, academic abilities, personalities, gender, friendship groups, learning needs and work habits.

Other factors that impact class arrangements are school enrolments (grade size) and staffing allocation. These two factors combined can have a significant bearing on what is possible across the school regarding grade and class structures.

#### Year 5 Leadership Development

Last week our Year 5 students participated in a Leadership Camp in preparation for selecting our student leaders for 2023. Since then, our year 5 students have stepped-up to support the Kinder Transition Session today where they lead tours and presented information about different spaces in the school. Soon they will be paired with a Kinder 2023 student as their buddy for next year.

It has also been encouraging to already have very healthy number of Year 5 students respond positively to the leadership opportunity by nominating themselves for the badged leader roles for 2023. Next week these Year 5 students will present a short speech to their classmates, class teachers and me to select the 5 girls and 5 boys to be put forward as possible School Leaders for 2023. We wish all candidates the best of luck.

# PASTORAL CARE FOCUS

Term 4 Weeks 5-6 We are respectful learners who learn and let others learn.

#### Why is it important to develop this skill?

We are hitting the middle of Term 4 already! We will start to feel like we are on the downhill towards the end of the year, but it is timely to remind children that there is still so much opportunity for learning to occur over these last 6 weeks. It is important to remember that all children have the right to an education. Children also have a responsibility to both their own learning and to allow the learning of others, through their actions.

Things we can encourage our students to do:

- Stay on task work with others that allow them to do their best Be active listeners
- - Work well independently, in partners, groups
- Be prepared for learning bring everything they need for their day to school
  - Cooperate well with others

Establish some good homework routines for independent learning.

Read at home with a parent each night or when possible.
