

PATRICK

389 - 467 | Bishop | 17 March

Born in England, Patrick's father was a Roman magistrate in Britain. When he was 16, Irish raiders kidnapped him. Patrick became the slave of a druid priest and worked as a shepherd.

After six years, he crept aboard a ship bound for Britain.

He studied in France and England. At age 43, Patrick became a bishop.

He felt God's call to return to Ireland

and worked miracles that showed people the power of the Christian God.

For 30 years, Patrick ordained priests

and built monasteries in Ireland.

A legend about St Patrick is that he explained the Holy Trinity to the people by using a shamrock, the three-leafed plant, which is today the Irish national emblem.

Term I Weeks 7 and 8

We are safe learners who use safe and caring actions.

Why is it important to develop this skill?

Over the next two weeks we are hoping to divide this Pastoral Care focus into its two parts. This week we will have a focus on SAFE ACTIONS and next week (Week 8) in align with Wellbeing Week and Mercy Values we will focus on the CARING ACTIONS.

SAFE ACTIONS: We are going to be looking at the reasons behind why we need to have safe actions towards others, in the classroom and on the playground. Particularly around being allergy conscious, not sharing food and being mindful of other's needs around us.

<u>CARING ACTIONS</u>: The theme for Wellbeing Week this term is "Mercy Values" - this will align with our <u>Project Compassion</u> fundraising and awareness of how we can help others in need. This will be launched by our Year 6 leaders in Peer Support groups on Friday during St Patrick's Day.

GUESS WHAT'S BACK...


Premier's Reading Challenge IS BACK.


