From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers, Girls and Boys,

We look forward to seeing the wonderful creations on display at the K-2 Easter Hat Parade that is scheduled for this Friday morning assembly. I hope the children have enjoyed getting their colourful hat ready to parade in front of the whole school.

We also look forward to the Year 6 Easter Egg Raffle fundraiser to raise money to purchase a gift for the school. Today is the last day to purchase tickets at school or online. Tickets for the Easter Egg Raffle are available online via QKR 1 for \$1.00, 3 for \$2.00 or 10 for \$5.00. As we have a large amount of prizes the raffle will be drawn after the Easter Hat Parade and throughout the day.

Parent/Teacher Interviews

Parent/Teacher Interviews are scheduled for Week 2 of Term 2 (May 1st-4th) with an evening session scheduled for Wednesday 3rd May. The interviews provide parents with an opportunity to meet their child's teacher and discuss their progress and set goals for the year ahead. Parents can now book an interview time with the child/ren's teacher via Compass. Parents can attend a face-to-face interview at school or attend via Zoom. Parking

A reminder to parents to please be considerate of our neighbours when parking for drop-off or pick-up during school days. This includes not using the carpark of St. John's Church across the road. I understand the busyness of trying to get children to and from school, however the church does not belong to the school and is not to be used for parking without permission.

PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

Covid-19

Although we have returned a more normal way of life in our school and the wider community, we have had recently reported cases of Covid-19 in Year 1 and 5. We are still operating under the requirement that: •Students and staff should continue to stay home when sick. Students, staff and visitors should only attend school when they are symptom free. We strongly encourage all students, staff and visitors to follow the guidance issued by NSW Health External. We will continue to send home students or staff displaying symptoms.

•Positive COVID-19 cases should be reported to the school if they have attended school recently. •NSW Health and the Department of Education encourage all students and staff who test positive to COVID-19 to record the positive rapid antigen test (RAT) through the Service NSW websiteExternal link or Service NSW appExternal link. Voluntary registration of your positive RAT with Service NSW can help you access health support and antiviral medicinesExternal link if you are eligible.

•Parents and carers are asked to select the name of the school or early childhood centre when registering a positive RAT via Service NSW.

•All families will receive additional RAT test kits. Positive RAT or PCR test results for staff and students should be reported to the school.

•Anyone who believes they have been exposed to COVID-19 is strongly recommended to monitor for symptoms and test if they have any concerns, as well as wear a mask.

I thank parents in advance for supporting these measures which keep our school community safe.



The SRC are leading the school to help reduce waste that goes into landfill. We will be participating in the Wonder Recycling for Schools as well as the Aussie Bread Tags for Wheelchairs projects.

Wonder Recycling for Schools

Thank you for all your efforts last year with bringing in bread bags to recycle. Not only did we receive some new sports equipment, but we managed to keep 15kgs of plastic out of landfill and were able to purchase some new sports equipment with the points we earnt.

Let's try and double that this year. We are now asking for bread bags again.

- 1. They can be any bag that has packaged bread wraps, buns, any brand of bread
- 2. Please shake out the crumbs for the birds. No need to wash them.
- 3. Keep a bread bag handy at home for the family to fill and bring it in once it is full.



Aussie Bread Tags for Wheelchairs

Last year we kept 6kgs of plastic bread tags out of landfill. They are now on their way down to Robe in South Australia to be recycled. The website below shows all the products that have been created from recycled bread tags. You may like to make a purchase yourself!
