# PASTORAL CARE FOCUS

Term 2 Weeks 9-10

We are safe learners who are at the right place, at the right time, doing the right task.

## Why is it important to develop this skill?

We are encouraging all students, now that we are heading towards the term to think about their responsibility to be in the right place, at the right time and doing the right task.

Some of the focuses we have had particularly this week are:

- Being settled at assembly, on lines and moving off to class, so that students are prepared for learning and transition in these parts of our day can be done more safely.
- Afternoon dismissal be out before 2.55pm and children moving to their right areas. We ask students to make sure they are being safe and waiting for parents to come to them before running out the gate.
- In class am I on task? Focused on learning and doing what I need to do?

How can I be safe at home, school, on transport etc?

Helping to make dinner or other chores at home.

How can you help develop this at home?

Have a checklist or calendar at home so they feel a sense of responsibility of the tasks that need accomplishing through the week.




