Term 3 Weeks I-2
We are respectful learners who
learn and let others learn.

Why is it important to develop this skill?

As we start back for Term 3... children sometimes need to remind ourselves of classroom expectations and routines for learning. The focus this fortnight is so students recognise their importance in contributing to the classroom learning environment, not only for themselves but in order to also help others learn.

We encourage children to utilise good learning behaviours in the classroom and routines at home to continue learning, whether it be through homework or everyday learning e.g. cooking, making, and creating. Working together with siblings or friends outside of school can help develop those problem-solving and relational skills with others.



Establish some good homework routines for independent learning.

Read at home with a parent each night or when possible.

Get older siblings to teach younger siblings new concepts.

How can you help develop this at home?

Tell your child something new about your life they might not know or teach them about a new concept they are interested in.

Develop time management skills to complete tasks around the house in accordance with other commitments.

We are very excited to have the opportunity to attend the 2023 World Youth Day Festival. World Youth Day (WYD) is the gathering of young people from all over the world with the Pope. It is also a pilgrimage, a celebration of youth, an expression of the universal Church and an intense moment of evangelisation for the Catholic youth of the world. From next week, we will be participating in a fortnight long pilgrimage which will take place in the capital city of Portugal - Lisbon and eventually conclude in Fatima. The highlights are the celebrations for which the Pope will be present, such as the Welcoming/ Opening Ceremony, the Way of the Cross, as well as the Vigil and Closing Masses. In addition to this, we will be connecting with like-minded pilgrims to engage in Catechesis, masses, praise, worship and leisure activities that will occur across the host city. The theme of the event is the biblical quote "Mary arose and went with haste" (Luke 1:39) which we are looking forward to unpacking further. We hope to be able to share everything that we learn from this experience with our students and the school community when we return!
