Dear Parents and Carers,

We have celebrated Well-being Week this week with a focus on Friendship in our Peer Support Groups. Peer Support activities are a great opportunity for our Year 5 and 6 students to develop and demonstrate their leadership skills and be positive role models to our younger students. It also provides a platform to develop connections and friendships across the grades while reinforcing the expected behaviours at school.

This week the children have also been acknowledged and rewarded for demonstrating positive behaviours particularly being "Friendship Ninjas" through the Spin the Wheel prizes. Children can gain and individual, group, class or grade reward for their positive behaviour.

National Child Protection Week

Well-being Week also coincides with National Child Protection Week. This week is a great time to consider how we all play a part in fostering a safe and supportive community for children and young people.

In our school and our diocese, we see Safeguarding as a shared responsibility and commit to ensuring our schools are safe for students to grow and flourish. We recognise that it takes a village to raise a child.

Each year, the children receive level appropriate lessons about personal safety as part of the Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE) programs. PDHPE is one of the six learning areas of the NSW Primary curriculum. Our school's PDHPE program aims to help our students develop and lead healthy, active and fulfilling lives. Part of this program includes Child Protection Education.

This week, all students will be taking part in a Cyber Safety session with our local Police Liaison Officer with the aim of providing practical knowledge about how to stay safe online. I encourage parents to have a discussion with their child/ren about how they can be cyber safe.

To support this further we have also organised a parent session for early next term focusing on cyber safety. I also include a few resources below that will assist parents in supporting child safety in our community.
