### **School Building Works**

#### **E-Library**

Last term, parents were sent information regarding a new E-Library reading resource that is now available to the children. This digital platform will provide all students access to over 3000 e-books. This resource will also assist the children accessing books during the new building works when we have a reduced number of library books available to borrow. ### Canteen

As you are aware this week the school canteen was closed on Wednesday as we were unable to attract parent/grandparent volunteers to assist. The canteen is a valued service that relies on the goodwill of parent support through volunteering. In recent times volunteer numbers have been reduced to a handful of parents and grandparents doing multiple shifts. I ask parents who are in the position to volunteer to consider supporting the school by offering an hour or two once a term to help in the canteen.



Term 4 Weeks I-2
We are respectful learners who
learn and let others learn.

### Why is it important to develop this skill?

Welcome back to Term 4! As we know, sometimes children need to remind themselves of classroom expectations and routines for learning. The focus this fortnight is so students recognise their importance in contributing to the classroom learning environment, not only for themselves but in order to also help others learn.

We encourage children to utilise good learning behaviours in the classroom and routines at home to continue learning, whether it be through homework or everyday learning e.g. cooking, making, and creating. Working together with siblings or friends outside of school can help develop those problem-solving and relational skills with others.



Establish some good homework routines for independent learning.

Read at home with a parent each night or when possible.

Get older siblings to teach younger siblings new concepts.

How can you help develop this at home?

Tell your child something new about your life they might not know or teach them about a new concept they are interested in.

Develop time management skills to complete tasks around the house in accordance with other commitments.


### KEEPING KIDS IN MIND FOR SEPARATING PARENTS – ONLINE PROGRAM – FROM 18 OCTOBER
