# PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

#### Year 5 Leadership Opportunities

Our entire Year 5 group demonstrated outstanding leadership this week as they supported the final Kinder 2024 Transition Session. It was exciting for our Year 5 students to meet their nominated buddy for next year and spend the morning together. This is a great way for our new students to be settled into the school and reduce any anxieties. I am so encouraged by our Year 5 groups efforts and proud of the way they have stepped-up to lead this initiative.

This week nominated Year 5 students also put themselves forward to be selected as a Colour House captain for 2024. It is very encouraging to have over 30 students nominating for a leadership position for 2024. Although there are only 10 badged leadership positions available, that I will be able call on any student to assist and support wherever needed.

All selected badged leaders will be announced at our Leadership Assembly on Friday of Week 8 from approximately 2:10pm. Please see below information about the Cake Stall and Coffee Van that will be occurring around this event.

#### **Semester 2 School Reports**

The class teachers are busily writing the Semester 2 Reports which will be available through your COMPASS App later in the term. This semester report will provide information on your child's achievement in the various curriculum areas and their learning dispositions for Term 3 and Term 4. Parents are encouraged to contact the office if you would like to discuss the report with your child's teacher.

#### **Class Arrangements for 2024**

At this time of year, a few parents may approach the school requesting their child to have a particular teacher or be in the same class as another student for the following year. I acknowledge that parents wish to advocate in the best interests of their child/ren, however it is not possible to promise any particular arrangements. The school is still in the process of finalising staffing for 2024 and teacher and class allocation are still being decided.

Please be aware that each year teachers take great care in arranging classes and although not a perfect science the teachers endeavour to balance the classes according to many factors including the children's social and emotional needs, academic abilities, personalities, gender, friendship groups, learning needs and work habits.

Other factors that impact class arrangements are school enrolments (grade size) and staffing allocation. These two factors combined can have a significant bearing on what is possible across the school regarding grade and class structures.

Often at St. Patrick's, the establishment of stage classes across two grades due to enrolment numbers is inevitable. As the classes in a stage group are taught the same topics and syllabus outcomes over two years, we can combine these groups without changing or impacting the learning required. There are no special criteria for children who are selected to be in a stage class.

If your circumstances have changed and you will be leaving the school at the end of the year could you please let us know via a phone call and email.
