The class teachers are finalising the Semester 2 Reports which will be available through your COMPASS App later in the term. This semester report will provide information on your child's achievement in the various curriculum areas and their learning dispositions for Term 3 and Term 4. Parents are encouraged to send an email to the office if you would like to discuss the report with your child's teacher.

Step Up- Class Arrangements for 2024

I have communicated in recent newsletters that while staff take great care when finalising class groups for 2024, there is a lot to be considered. The teachers endeavour to balance the classes according to many factors including the children's social and emotional needs, academic abilities, personalities, gender, friendship groups, learning needs and work habits. Other factors that impact class arrangements are school enrolments (grade size) and staffing allocation. These two factors combined can have a significant bearing on what is possible across the school regarding grade and class structures. Often at St. Patrick's, the establishment of stage classes across two grades due to enrolment numbers is inevitable. As the classes in a stage group are taught the same topics and syllabus outcomes over two years, we can combine these groups without changing or impacting the learning required. There are no special criteria for children who are selected to be in a stage class. Next week, the children in Kinder to Year 5 will find out their class group and class teacher for 2024. I ask parents to please 'talk up' your child's teacher and potential options in the lead-up to this date. It is the best way to ensure a positive build-up to next year.

Please do not engage in discussions that might inadvertently undermine our very hardworking staff, or indeed families and children in classes. This achieves very little good but often sets the way for hurt feelings and difficulties.

We have organised for the children to spend some time with their new teacher on the afternoon of Wednesday 6th December which will be a helpful transition to learning in 2024.

It takes many hours to determine the classes across all year groups. Once classes at school are announced, we cannot change them. I thank you for your support of our school and look forward to a great year of learning in 2024.

We ask parents to contact the school via email or phone call if your circumstances have changed and you will be leaving the school at the end of the year.

Enrolment Opportunities at St. Leo's Wahroonga

Yesterday I communicated to parents that St. Leo's has advised that after several rounds of offers for Year 7 2025, they are now at waitlist stage for any remaining 2025 applicants who have not yet advised St. Leo's via the online enquiry form that they are interested in attending St Leo's.

All applications received to date from each Priority Feeder School have been offered a position, however any remining late 2025 applicants will now need to join the waitlist. To give an indication of numbers, St. Leo's will be accepting just over 200 Year 7s in 2025, and already have an additional 80+ on our waiting list for that year.

Attached is an advertisement that I will also place in the school newsletter along with this reminder to enrol now if you are interested in sending your child/ren to St. Leo's. I take this opportunity to highlight this to all families but especially our Year 3 and 4 families that now would be the ideal time for them to complete an online application for St Leo's. I understand that St. Leo's have applications that go up to 2036. By applying now, you ensure that your application is further up on the priority list. A reminder also that there are no application or acceptance fees involved for St Leo's.

Building Works

The Building Works have started with some preliminary work being carried out on site by various trades. There has been a delay in delivering the Temporary Classroom and Building Site Offices due to access, safety provisions and weather. These are now expected to be delivered on Monday 4th December. Other works have also been delayed and the expected movement of classes and equipment will not happen until late in Week 10. This decision will minimise impact on classes for this year.
