Communication Methods & Protocols

Communication is an important and crucial aspect to our work as partners. Each year the communication protocols are provided to the community to support that vital partnership between home and school. The school values strong and respectful communication and when we get this right, the children are best supported.

If you wish to speak to a teacher:

- You can make contact through the school office staff by phone, via email or in person. The office staff will pass this message onto the teacher concerned. The teacher will either confirm an appointment, or phone to talk within a reasonable timeframe (usually 24 to 48 hours or the following Monday if contact is made on a Friday). Often a return call might come earlier, but for practical reasons, at least one day's grace is required.

If it is a matter to be conveyed in writing:

- Please either send a note to the teacher/staff member or an email to the front office.
- Emails will be forwarded to the teacher within normal hours and in a timely way. If confidential, please send as an attachment and mark as confidential. The school email address is: spa@dbb.catholic.edu.au

- I ask that parents don't email teachers/staff directly. Emails received late at night or on weekends can impact on a staff member's personal and family situations and add to their stresses, especially if the matter is emotive or subjective. Also, if a staff member is on leave, delays in response can result.

I thank all parents in advance for adhering to and respecting these protocols and for your continued support.

Parent Information Meetings

Parent Information Meetings will take place next week on Tuesday 13th and Wednesday 14th February. This year we ask parents to attend in person at school (in classrooms).

The purpose of these meetings is to provide an opportunity at the start of the school year for parents and carers to collectively meet their child's teacher. It will also allow teachers to provide information to parents and carers about class, grade and school routines and expectations, curriculum topics and planned events.

These meetings are not meant for individual parent meetings. Parents who have important information they wish to communicate to their child's class teacher are encouraged to make an appointment through the school office or communicate information via an email to the school office to be passed on to the class teacher.

Parking, Morning Drop Off and Afternoon Pickup

This week I outlined the procedures for the morning and afternoon drop off and dismissal routines. Thank you to parents who are mindful of driving slowly, using the pedestrian crossing and being vigilant with their young ones. I encourage parents using drive through to have the family name card on display to assist with calling children to be ready for pick up.

Name cards for new families will be sent home soon. Any parents requiring a replacement family name card are asked to contact the school office.

Safety is highly valued in our school community. Please remember to stay in your car when dropping off or picking up in the 'No Parking Zone' at the front of the school. When parents leave their vehicle to assist their child it slows the process down significantly and causes frustration.

I ask as a community we remain patient, keep calm and follow the protocols so that safety is maintained.

Swimming Carnival

Monday and Friday Assemblies

Our main assemblies each week occur on Monday and Friday mornings. Each Monday we pray (school prayer), acknowledge the traditional owners of the local area, raise the flag and sing the national anthem, celebrate birthdays and acknowledge students with behaviour awards. At Friday assemblies we acknowledge selected children for the week who have gained a merit or pastoral care award.

Although many parents need to drop students at school each morning and then begin their day I invite and encourage parents to consider joining us for a morning assembly from time to time.

Staff Development Day

Each year our staff have days set aside during the school year for professional learning opportunities. The school has planned a Staff Development Day for the last day of Term 1, Friday 12th April. As a result, this day will be a student free day. Supervision may be offered by our wonderful Before and After School provider, Royston Kid's, depending on numbers to make it financially viable.

40 Days

The season of Lent lasts 40 days (not counting Sundays) and represents the 40 days that Jesus spent in the desert. This is a time of reflection, repentence and growing closer to God. We are asked to pray, fast and give to help prepare our hearts for Jesus at Easter

Pray

Prayer is our conversation with God. During Lent we should take more oportunities to talk with God and listen for what he has to say to us through the scriptures.

Fast

What can we give up during Lent so as to grow closer to God. Perhaps we go without our favourite treats or stop playing video games and instead use that time to help someone.

Give

Giving is the ways that we are able to support others especially those less fortunate than us. It may be through donations to Project Compassion or by giving of our time.
