#### **Stage 3 Bathurst Excursion**

We wish our Year 5 and 6 students well as they embark on a three-day excursion to explore the rich history of the Hill End and the Bathurst Goldfields.

Our students will travel over the Blue Mountains witnessing the stunning views at Echo Point and The Three Sisters. They will then be travelling on to discover the history of Hill End as they roam around the preserved buildings of Hill End township and discover what life was like on the goldfields.

At Bathurst Goldfields, our students will step back in time. Seeing artefacts, restored buildings and equipment of by-gone days, and preserved sites, they'll find themselves in the gold-rush era. They will engage with tours around the site, role-play activities, and hands-on experiences like gold panning.

On their return journey they will visit Scenic World and ride on the steepest railway in the world and a walk along the board walk through the Jamison Valley.

I thank the staff travelling with the children in advance for giving their time away from their family to facilitate the excursion. I am sure the children will have an enjoyable time with their peers and make lifelong memories.

#### Parent/Teacher Interviews

Parent/Teacher Interviews are scheduled for Week 2 of Term 2 (May 6th-9th) with an evening session scheduled for Wednesday 8th May. The interviews provide parents with an opportunity to meet their child's teacher and discuss their progress and set goals for the year ahead. Parents are now able to book a face-to-face interview time with their child/ren's teacher via Compass.

### **School Uniform**

I am thankful for the overwhelming support by our parent community to send their child/ren each day dressed in their correct school uniform. In the last few weeks, we have had only a handful of students needing reminders about wearing the correct shoes or refraining from wearing additional items that are not part of the school uniform.

A reminder to parents that the beginning of next term, we will have a 'phase in' period towards Winter uniform. Students may wear either full Summer or full Winter uniform for the first three weeks of Term 2. Students should be in full Winter uniform by Monday 20th May. #### **Student Free Day Friday 12th April**

Even though last Tuesday's pupil free day was well advertised we still had had a few children arrive at school expecting normal lessons. All teachers will be attending a Professional Learning Day offsite and the school will be closed. #### **After School Care**

#### QuizzaMe-Trivia Night

The challenge has been set to all parents- Who can beat the teachers at the upcoming P&F Trivia Night? We are looking forward to a great night of trivia, games and fun and hope to see lots of parents coming along. The P&F Trivia Night is being run by a professional trivia quiz company called QuizzaMe. QuizzaMe uses buzzers to deliver a game-show like experience. All questions are multiple choice and selected from a great range of categories. - · Provides teachable moment with children about our environment






# PADDY'S CARE GROUP


# **Maths challenge**
