The school has become a little quieter with the completion of the last stage of the classroom refurbishment. This week Year 1 and 2 class groups along with their class resources were successfully relocated to their new classrooms. The children were excited to be back in their usual space along with new surroundings and furniture. The new library furniture arrives on Friday, but we expect that it will take a week or two to return all the resources to the shelves. As a result, the children will not be able to borrow physical books during this time. Children and parents are again reminded that the E-Library reading resources are available to the children. 
