PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE

Dear Parents, Carers, Girls and Boys,

The P&F Association at our school plays a crucial role in fostering a vibrant and supportive school community. Their dedication and hard work have a significant positive impact for our school which is evident through engaging many school events, by building an active and strong community as well as supporting the acquisition of school resources to enhance learning experiences.

Last night we held the first of our P&F Meetings for the year where we were able to update parents about a few initiatives we have in 2025 and show some of the new resources the school has acquired through the support of funds from the P&F.

At the meeting Miss Fryar, our amazing Well-being Coordinator, presented a new initiative the school has adopted to support student learning and wellbeing. Our new Positive Behaviours for Learning or PBL initiative builds on the work we already have in place to support student learning and wellbeing. PBL is a whole school approach to behaviour support that adopts proactive strategies for defining, teaching, and supporting appropriate student behaviours to create positive school environments. Through this program the students are being taught explicitly the expected behaviours through our behaviour curriculum. I thank Miss Fryar and our staff for implementing the various elements of the PBL program over the past term. We look forward to continuing to provide a Safe, Responsible and Respectful learning environment for the students in our care.

The school also showed the new resources that we obtained with the support of funds from the P&F. The school purchased Lego Spike and Lego BricQ Motion kits that enhance the teaching Science and Technology, Mathematics and Literacy. I am sure these resources will be well used and valued by the staff and students. A huge thank you to our parent community led by our our P&F for supporting the purchase of these wonderful resources.

Maths challenge Presents


Here's a new puzzle to try this week!
