Joy that was included in last week's parish bulletin

Dear Friends in Christ,

As you all know, I am leaving Australia after 14 years of priestly ministry on the 1st of April. My heart is filled with gratitude and fond memories, especially to the parish of Ku-ring-gai Chase, where I spent six long years of my ministry time. I come from India, a land of diverse culture, religion and language. You have to make an extensive travel to experience this multi-dimension in my home country. On the contrary, in Australia, my adopted new home, I was lucky to experience this diverse, multi-cultural dimension within a suburb. It was a great experience for me to acquaint myself with people from across the globe within a parish set up.

As I return home, I carry with me an experience and learning of a lifetime. Serving the Church in Australia has been a privilege and a blessing. The love, concern, care and encouragement I have received from the Church authorities and the People of God have sustained and strengthened me in my vocation. I don't dare to mention any names, since it is too many people to name.

Finally, a word of thanks for putting up with me To those I may have wronged, I ask forgiveness. To those I may have helped, I wish I did more. To those I neglected to help, I ask for understanding. To those who helped me, I sincerely thank you so much ... Transfers may set us apart, but friendship will keep us connected.
