### We have a new Pope!

Last week the conclave of cardinals elected a new Pope. Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost has been elected the 267th Successor of Saint Peter. He will be known as Pope Leo XIV.

Born in Chicago, United States, Prevost, 69, studied science and mathematics before joining the Order of St Augustine in 1977. He spent many years in Peru as a missionary and teacher as well as two six-year terms as Prior General of the Augustinians, and also holds Peruvian citizenship.

Our prayers are with our Pope as he enters his leadership and mission.

"Lord, grant me the wisdom to lead with integrity and humility. Help me to make decisions that are just and fair, and to always seek your will in all that I do.

Give me the courage to stand up for what is right, even when it is difficult. Help me to be a servant leader, always putting the needs of others before my own,
