PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE

Dear Parents and Carers,

We began welcoming the first group of our Kinder 2026 to their initial Transition Day this week. We had a lovely morning with half the group organising school uniforms, meeting each other and beginning their school experience at St. Patrick's Asquith.

Our Year 5 student leaders stepped up to support their new Kinder buddies and begin the year-long partnership that will nurture our new students and help them settle into the school routine. This important and valued relationship between our future Year 6 students and Kinder students helps the young ones understand the expectations for our school and what it means to belong to our wonderful school community. Next week it will be exciting to welcome the second half of the Kinder 2026 group for their first transition experience from preschool to big school.

Brainstorm Productions Presents: The Protectors

This week, our students were treated to a meaningful and engaging live theatre experience called 'The Protectors'. The performance seeks to educate and support student wellbeing focusing on bullying, cyber safety, emotional resilience, and respectful relationships.

The performance piece was developed by educators and a clinical psychologist and seeks to spark meaningful conversations in the classroom. The message to students is encouragement to become "protectors" of themselves and others—standing up to bullying, seeking help, and fostering kindness and inclusion in their communities.

Surf Life Saving NSW Beach to Bush Incursion

This week, all students had the exciting opportunity to take part in the Surf Life Saving NSW (SLSNSW) Beach to Bush Incursion. With the warm weather encouraging families to visit the beach, the local pool, and waterways, this interactive educational program is a timely reminder of the vital water safety knowledge all students need.

The volunteer surf lifesavers presentation provided experiences including examples of visual safety signs used to educate and warn the community of dangers, real-life stories, and hands-on activities. During the sessions the students learned how to:

- Identify beach hazards like rips and waves
- Understand the importance of swimming between the red and yellow flags
- Recognise safety signs and marine life
- Signal for help and assist others safely
- Apply these lessons to inland waterways such as rivers, dams, and pools [slst.asn.au]

The program is tailored to suit our students who may not be regular swimmers, ensuring that even students who have never visited the beach can relate to safety messages. Each child also received a Beach to Bush pack to reinforce learning and share knowledge with their families. We are grateful to Surf Life Saving NSW for their commitment to educating and helping our students to become confident, informed, and safe around water—whether at the beach or in their own backyard.

Our exciting SPARK program aims to ignite the SPARK of curiosity, challenge, collaboration and skill development among students who are showing high potential or giftedness in certain domains. Our SPARK program is aimed at offering a range of immersive extension days for students in Stage 3 to collaborate with likeminded peers whilst engaging in rich learning opportunities.

St Patrick's hosted a SPARK Lego Escape room Day on the 23rd of October 2025. Students worked against time in a hands-on day involving resilience in problem solving and critical and creative thinking, with a Lego theme. Students thought creatively and logically, and strategize to solve decoding puzzles. The challenges required out-of-the-box solutions, encouraging innovation and flexible thinking, as well as improving teamwork and collaborative skills.

Many students have benefited from these SPARK days this year, as there has been different aspects of gifted and high potential learning opportunities.

We hope to see it continue with our neighbouring schools next year.














On the weekend of 15th and 16th November, the NSW talent enrichment weekend will be held for primary students at
