## PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE

Dear Parents and Carers, Girls and Boys

A reminder of the importance of daily attendance at school. The following is an excerpt from the CSBB Attendance Policy, which can be accessed via the policies link on our website.

**'School attendance plays a crucial role in enhancing the lives of students. Every day of attendance adds to a student's opportunity to learn, develop and experience success in education. CSBB is committed to working in partnership with parents and carers to promote and encourage student attendance to maximise opportunities for student learning growth. All students who are enrolled at a CSBB school are expected to attend each day, unless they are unwell, unable to attend for an approved reason or have been granted an exemption.**

**CSBB schools, in partnership with families, are responsible for promoting and encouraging the regular attendance of students. While parents are legally responsible for the regular attendance of their children, school staff members monitor student attendance daily, including part or whole day absences, as a consequence of both their duty of care and legislative requirements.'**

As a result of this policy, we are obliged to monitor and follow up on absences where the total absences exceed 10% of total school time. If your child falls into this category you may receive an email about this. When entering an absence on Compass you will now be prompted to give an explanation. If we can support you and your family in improving your child's attendance, please reach out to your class teacher as the first point of call.

## A visit to Kindergarten

This week our Kinder parents had two opportunities to visit their child's classroom to see and celebrate their achievements. It has been a busy but also rewarding start to kindergarten with the children establishing new routines and making new friends. I congratulate the children and their teachers for all they have achieved in such a short time.

## Enrolment for 2027

I have well and truly begun the enrolment process with about 15 Kindergarten interviews completed and many more already booked in before the end of the term. I continue to have great feedback from prospective parents about their Open Day experience, especially about the wonderful job our Year 6 leaders did in conducting the school tours.

A reminder to parents, if you are aware of families that have children ready to start school next year, I encourage you to recommend our school and the offer to come and find out more information. Prospective parents can contact the school to have a private tour and pick up an enrolment pack from the school office or enquire online via a link on our website.

If you have a child starting next year, I strongly encourage you to complete your enrolment form and return it to the school office as soon as possible, as this will help secure your child's place for kindergarten in 2027.

We held a very successful P&F Annual General Meeting on Wednesday evening with over 30 parents joining online or attending face-to-face in the library. I again whole-heartedly thank our long serving members of the P&F who are not continuing in their roles in 2026.

Our new P & F executive team is being finalised and will be the subject of a separate Compass notification next week. We look forward to working together for our school community.




## St Patrick's Day - 17<sup>th</sup> March



### PATRICK

389 – 467 | Bishop | 17 March

Born in England, Patrick's father was a Roman magistrate in Britain. When he was 16, Irish raiders kidnapped him. Patrick became the slave of a druid priest and worked as a shepherd.

After six years, he crept aboard a ship bound for Britain.

He studied in France and England.

At age 43, Patrick became a bishop.

He felt God's call to return to Ireland and worked miracles that showed people the power of the Christian God.

For 30 years, Patrick ordained priests and built monasteries in Ireland.

A legend about St Patrick is that he explained the Holy Trinity to the people by using a shamrock, the three-leaved plant, which is today the Irish national emblem.






# 2026 NSW Premier's Reading Challenge

Celebrating 25 years of reading

## The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge is now open and St Patrick's is excited to be participating!

### Celebrating 25 years of the Premier's Reading Challenge

This year marks the 25th anniversary of the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge! Since it began in 2001, millions of students across New South Wales have enjoyed taking part in this wonderful reading journey. St Patrick's is proud to be celebrating this milestone and joining in the fun again this year!

### What is the NSW PRC?

The PRC is a statewide initiative that encourages students to develop a lifelong love of reading for fun and pleasure. It is not a competition, but a challenge to inspire every student to read more books and explore different kinds of stories and information.

All students who complete the Challenge and have their reading logged and validated by Mrs Wickham will receive a certificate signed by the Premier of NSW.

### How many books do students need to read?

- **Kindergarten to Year 2:** Read or experience 30 books in total. At least 20 must come from the official PRC booklists, and up to 10 can be books of their own choice. Books can be read by the student, or shared with a parent, carer, teacher, or another student. **Year 3 to Year 10:** Read
- 20 books independently. At least 10 must come from the official PRC booklists, and up to 10 can be books of their own choice.


If a book is part of an approved PRC series, students can include up to 5 of those books on their Challenge list and up to 10 more from the same series as Personal Choice books.

Books must be added to students' online reading records by **Friday 18 September 2026** to be validated and qualify for a certificate.

### How do students log their reading?

Students can log their reading using the PRC Student Experience website, which they can access via the link

# What do students get for completing the PRC?

- 1-3 years of completion:** Standard certificate
- 4 years of completion:** Gold certificate
- 5-6 years of completion:** Standard certificate
- 7 years of completion:** Platinum certificate
- 8-10 years of completion:** Standard certificate

**PRC Medal:** The PRC medal is awarded to Year 9 or 10 students only.


Year 9 students qualify by completing the Challenge every year from Year 3 to Year 9. Year 10 students qualify by completing the Challenge seven times between Year 3 and Year 10, allowing them to skip one year.

When students complete the challenge, their name will be displayed in the library. The first 2 classes to complete the challenge win a class prize.

If your child has previously participated in the PRC but has changed schools, make sure you check their challenge history. If they have previously attended a non-government school, their accounts may need to be merged. If this applies to you please let Mrs Wickham know so she can do this for you.
